After this I looked, and there before me was a door standing open in heaven. They were dressed in white and had crowns of gold on their heads. 5From the throne came flashes of lightning, rumblings and peals of thunder. In front of the throne, seven lamps were

blazing. These are the seven spirits^o of God. ⁶Also in front of the throne there was what looked like a sea of glass, clear as crystal.








The Chain of Transmission for the Book of Revelation


Notes

These messages represent how the Lord Jesus sees our churches and their members—you and me. The important thing is not how we appear to ourselves or others but how we appear to Him.

There are some of the strengths and weaknesses of these churches in every congregation and in every one of us. These diagnostic evaluations help us make corrections and become the people Jesus wants us to be.

These two chapters represent the two thousand years of Christian history—not necessarily seven different stages of church history, but what the Lord wants His church to be between the ascension and the tribulation.




Revelation on a Napkin

My thesis in *The 50 Final Events in World History* is that Revelation is understandable, that God wants us to anticipate the reality of His coming victory and the broad outlines of earth's final days and the Glory to follow. More than a few times, I've pulled out an ink pen and sketched the outline of Revelation on a napkin while meeting someone for coffee. You can do the same!

First, I draw a rectangle and label it REV.



Next, I draw three vertical lines like this:




I use abbreviations to designate these as introduction (I), seven

churches (7 and a sketch of a church building), and heaven (H). I also add the chapter numbers below.


I explain that the first chapter of Revelation is the book's introduction, giving its author, recipients, purpose, and opening vision—the enthroned Christ, who appeared to John. The next two chapters are individual messages to seven churches, and we can learn how to follow Christ better by the counsel they contain. The last two chapters describe our heavenly home.


I then draw another line with an added arrow and explain that chapters 19–20 describe the second coming of Christ and what He'll do when He returns.




That leaves the middle part of the book—chapters 4–18. These chapters describe seven years of tribulation, when evil is judged and earth is prepared for its reunion with Jesus. I use the abbreviation *TRIB* for the tribulation.



Using a dotted line, I box off chapters 4-5, saying those chapters describe the scene at the throne of God at the beginning of the tribulation. I use a T for throne, with a circle around it, because the throne was encircled by the heavenly host.




Now we have chapters 6-18, which describe what will happen on earth during these seven years. In the middle of the remaining space I draw a circle and say that is the midpoint in the tribulation.



The rest is easy. Chapters 6–11 describe the first half of the tribulation, which is marked by the opening of the seven seals and the blowing of seven trumpets, all representing judgments that will fall on the earth. I put two sevens in this space and indicate this is chapters 6–11.

The middle of the tribulation is described in chapters 12–13. And the last half of the tribulation is in chapters 14–18, which describe the final judgments—seven bowls of wrath poured out on the earth. It ends with the battle of Armageddon, which I illustrate using a bolt of lightning.



Having drawn this sketch, I review it all simply.

The book of Revelation has twenty-two chapters. The first is introductory. The next two are messages to the churches of the last days.

The unfolding events of the tribulation begin with the throne scene in chapters 4–5. The events on earth will unfold over seven years.

The first three and a half years will be marked by seven seals and seven trumpets, described in chapters 6–11. The terrible events of the middle of the tribulation are described in chapters 12–13, and the last three and a half years of tribulation unfold in chapters 14–18, ending in the battle of Armageddon and the return of Christ in chapters 19–20.

The final two chapters tell us of God's perfect eternal kingdom, where we will see Jesus, serve Him, and be with His people forever.

I often tell the person, "While the details and images of Revelation may seem overwhelming, the overall structure and message of the book is as simple as saying, 'God is working now in His church, and one day soon a cataclysm of some sort will trigger the final seven years of history preceding His return.'

"Here is the outline of Revelation. By understanding this, your further study of the details will make more sense. Don't be afraid of Revelation. It's as exciting as the Lord's return and will help prepare us for that glorious day."
